

## Guidelines for PhD presentations

- 1) Slides and oral presentations must be prepared/given in English language
- 2) The first slide should include: title of your PhD work, your name, your supervisor's name, PhD Cycle, etc.
- 3) A slide with the outline of your PhD showing the foreseen activities and how they are linked should be present
- 4) A clear timeline of your PhD activities should be indicated
- 5) The year to which the presented activities refer to should be clearly specified
- 6) Text and figures should be readable (decipherable) to the audience
- 7) The objective of the work should be clearly indicated
- 8) Slides have to be circulated to the PhD committee members at least 2 days before they are planned to be presented orally
- 9) Publications:
  - Details (authors, title, journal, Impact factor, quartile) of your published/accepted peer review manuscripts, where you are one of the co-authors and which are produced in the framework of your PhD program, should be reported in your presentation.
  - It is expected to have the PhD student as a first author at least in two published/accepted publications by the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> year, before his/her admission to the final exams. In any case, the specific contribution/role of the student to each publication must be clearly specified.
